**GILL SANS AND ANATOMY**

Gill Sans is a san-serif typeface designed by Eric Gill. Gill Sans was first bared in a single upper-case weight in 1928. The font became popular almost immediately. The proportions of Gill Sans stem from monumental Roman Capitals in the upper case and traditional "old-style" serif letters in the lower. The upper case of Gill Sans is somewhat formed after Roman capitals. Gill Sans success was greatly assisted by Marketing. Other fonts influenced type's high-level marketing. Other fonts are FF Scala Sans and Mr and Mrs Eyes.

Gill Sans is a sans-serif typeface designed by Eric Gill. It was first released by the Monotype Corporation in 1928. The font is characterized by its clean, geometric design and clear readability. It features a unique set of characters, including ligatures like 'fi' and 'ff', and a variety of letter forms. The 'I' and 'l' characters have a distinct vertical stroke, and the 'A' has a small loop at the top. The 'E' has a small 'ear' at the top left. The 'G' has a 'spine' in the middle.
